The Caps of Love Project is wrapping up. Affiliations were asked to discontinue collections as of the end of May. Collections will be accepted until all have been received. If affiliations choose to continue collections it will be on an individual basis. Thank you to each participating affiliation for their enthusiastic response to this DCCW service project for the benefit of children in need of a wheelchair.

Sue Steverson has thus far delivered 5 carloads of caps to Lake Worth and Sue Weathersbee delivered a truck/trailer load.

The project director in Lake Worth, Valerie Mathieu reports she has, to date, delivered 18 wheelchairs to children and has 20 more ready to be delivered. She has outgrown the 5 donated storage units and is in the process of looking for a donated warehouse to collect and process caps!!

If you want to continue following or participating with this project, be aware that the U.S. charity name will be changing. Caps of Love is the name for the program headquartered in France. They wanted to assess Valerie \$2000 to continue using their logo so she is in the process of developing a new name/logo for her project here in the U.S.
